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2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>The lockdowns caused by COVID had affected students taking classes in person in the last one and a half years. Thanks to the advances in technology, we were able to offer the flexibility needed, whether through traditional in-person classes, online learning, or a blend of the two.</p> <p>Although this was a new concept, sufficient training was given by the computer science department first to faculty members and then to student groups. Initially there were many disturbances for it was relatively new to all but soon the advantages outweighed the issues.</p> <p>There are many advantages to online courses; they allow one to learn whenever, wherever, and however that works best for them.</p> <p>Adarsh Centre for e learning and Teaching was established (ACeLT) with a room designated with state of art facilities available. This was helpful if faculty members came to college and students accessed thro online.</p> <p>Online classes did present unique challenges, however, our faculty members developed skills for effective online learning and students cooperated maximum.</p> <p>Regular meetings were conducted to sort out issues and make alternate arrangements. Timetable was drafted with 40 minute classes – 5 classes per day with sufficient breaks. This took care of data the students were willing to use.</p> <p>Tests and assignments were also taken care of thro online mode. Student participation was maximum. The following was considered mandatory:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Discipline and dedication: The discipline to sit down and to work as well as the dedication to actually follow through was given importance. Parents also helped in this to some extent</li> <li>2. Hold oneself accountable Setting goals at the beginning of the semester and checking in with oneself weekly was followed up. Verbal or whatsapp reminders of an assignment's upcoming due date helped in completion of allotted assignments many times the day before it's due.</li> <li>3. Practicing time management. The flexibility in work had to be adjusted with time management. Though how a student manages his time will depend on learning style, and personality. Faculty members planned systematically.</li> <li>4. Creating a regular study space and staying organized. Both faculty and students set up a dedicated learning environment for studying and teaching. By completing work there repeatedly, student begins to establish a routine.</li> <li>5. Eliminating distractions. Exactly how much of a challenge these distractions will prove to be will depend on the student's unique personality and situation. Ultimately, together both staff and students found a strategy that worked best.</li> <li>6. Figuring Out How You Learn Best Not everyone learns the same way, so different ways of providing help was discussed and new concepts were employed to provide relevant study strategies. A visual learner, for example, can use print out transcripts to review. Learning by listening technique was used by recording lectures. Active participation was also encouraged in classes that motivated students.</li> <li>7. Practice Makes Perfect Many assignments were given and students regularly submitted assignments. 100% result was received in the University conducted examination.</li> </ol>
